

Indigenous Mentoring Webinar What Country Are You On?

At the beginning of the webinar we asked you to let us know what Country you were on. Thank you to those who responded, we thought we would share the results with you.

Kaurna:

The Kaurna are the original people of Adelaide and the Adelaide Plains.

Yidinji Land:

Aboriginal Australian people in Far North Queensland.

Jagera Country:

This group is one of the traditional custodians of the land over which much of Brisbane is built.

Dharawal Country:

Traditional custodians of the land on which Wollongong central resides.

Gadigal people of the Eora Nation:

A group of indigenous Australians whose traditional lands are located in Sydney.

Larrakia country Land of the Wurundjeri people:

The Larrakia people are the traditional owners of the Darwin region.

Jardwadjali:

Aboriginal Australian people of the state of Victoria.

Latie Latie and Barkinii:

Australian Aboriginal tribal group of the Darling River basin in Far West New South Wales.

Darug Country:

The Darug, originally a Western Sydney people, are an Aboriginal Australian people who share strong ties of kinship.

Aotearoa, New Zealand:

Aotearoa is the Māori name for New Zealand. It was originally used by the Māori people in reference to only the North Island.

Wurundjeri people of the Kulin Nation:

Traditional Owners of the land that is now known as the City of Yarra.









Giabal and Jarowair:

The indigenous tribes of the Jagera, Giabal and Jarowair people inhabited the Darling Downs.

Yorta Yorta:

Aboriginal Australian people who have traditionally inhabited the area surrounding the junction of the Goulburn and Murray Rivers.

Ngunnawal:

Indigenous Australian people of southern New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory.

Yuin:

Australian Aboriginal people from the South Coast of New South Wales.

Wangkatha:

Identity of eight tribal groups of the Eastern Goldfields region, which is in the southeastern corner of Western Australia.

Wadjuk Noongar Land:

Whadiuk, alternatively Witiari, are a Noongar (Aboriginal Australian) people of the Western Australian region.

Dunghutti:

Aboriginal Australian people resident in the Macleay Valley of northern New South Wales

Gubbi Gubbi:

Indigenous Australian people native to southeastern Queensland.

Aggreko, Bunurong Country:

Bunurong People who formed part of what was the Kulin nation, a group of five tribes that occupied Victoria's central district surrounding Port Phillip Bay and its hinterland.

Cammeraygal Country:

The Cammeraygal were a clan of the Eora tribe Indigenous Australians that inhabited the Lower North Shore of Sydney.

Birpai Country:

The Birpai are an indigenous Australian people of New South Wales.

Gumbayngirr Country:

The Gumbaynggirr lands stretch from the Nambucca River in the South to around the Clarence River in the North and the Great Dividing Range in the West.
